Company Profile

Port Klang Authority (PKA), a statutory body under the Ministry of Transport Malaysia was established in 1963 to take over the role of administration Port Klang from the Malaysian.

Railways. Following the nation's independence in 1957, PKA was entrusted to develop new facilities to handle the nation's booming trade given its location close to the capital, Kuala Lumpur. Beginning 1986, the port facilities were privatized to two private companies, i.e Northport (Malaysia) Bhd and Westports Malaysia Sdn Bhd while the Authority assumed new roles mainly trade facilitator, port planning & development, regulatory oversight of privatized facilities & services, free zone authority and asset management. PKA through its subsidiary also operates a 1,000-acre free zone industrial and commercial park primarily handling goods for storage and distribution to Asia – Pacific region. Port Klang is an important economic driver for Malaysia and a key player in the global trade ecosystem. Port Klang is today ranked as the 11th busiest container port in the world connecting Malaysia with more than 350 ports in over 130 countries across the globe.
